Remarkably, my childhood aspiration to draw like my 3rd-grade teacher, Mr. McCannie, persisted even at the tender age of 8, convinced he deserved a place at Marvel.

As I matured, my love for basketball took center stage, bringing with it an unwavering desire for victory. The game instilled in me a relentless pursuit of success, significantly shaping my evolving journey. Early on, I embraced an indomitable attitude of never giving up, fueled by the camaraderie of my mentors—my big brothers, including Ian, Jermaine, Komer, and Lee. Our battleground was Wingate Park, where we engaged in relentless competition. These formidable figures, both perpetual rivals and sources of inspiration, played a dual role in fueling my ambitions. From basketball to various sports, our friendly yet fiercely competitive matches laid the foundation for my resilient mindset. Even in my

formative years, I found myself surrounded by individuals who ignited my ambitions. Witnessing my cousins, Nikki, Troy, Ian, Jermaine, and Komer, thriving in college fueled my determination to pursue higher education. As a teenager, I was eager to showcase the skills honed in battles against my older brothers.

Upon graduating from Junior school, my focus shifted towards college aspirations. Pivotal moments manifested during the Never Give Up and West 4th tournaments, where we clinched back-to-back titles in 1994 and 1995. Guided by our coach, True, I gleaned valuable lessons in team defense and the collective strength of a united team. This experience reshaped my perspective, emphasizing the significance of collaborative success over individual triumphs.

The essence of my journey echoes a simple truth—success in life demands an insatiable thirst for excellence. Upon completing this chapter, envision me standing before you, posing questions that echo the essence of determination: "How hungry are you? How important is your success to you? What sacrifices will you make?" In the championship games at West 4th and St. Johns, I found myself on the bench. It wasn't a role I relished, but my burning desire for victory overshadowed personal preferences. The hunger for success drove me to accept any role that contributed to the team's triumph.

In contrast, tournaments like the Never Give Up presented formidable challenges, witnessing early exits in the first two years. Despite starting in all of them, it was surprising when my childhood friend Collie expressed admiration, uttering, "I look up to you." His words became a source of unexpected inspiration, reinforcing the impact of a never-give-up attitude.

For those reading this with past obstacles hindering progress, I implore you to forgive yourself. The ability to break free from the shackles of the past is crucial for shaping your present and future. Time, an irreversible force, underscores the importance of believing in your current self and the person you've become.

As I ventured into college, a transformation began. Reading became a cornerstone of my routine. In my senior year of high school, I shared with my cousin Silvia my aspiration to own a business, though the specifics eluded me. The release of the movie "The Best Man" in 1999 planted the seed for my own book. The idea simmered, and during this period, I distanced myself from many, including family, not out of personal detachment but as part of planning and researching the art of writing.

A serendipitous encounter with a book vendor on my daily route to the number 4 train sparked a pivotal moment. The purchase of "Looking for Luv" by Carl Weber fueled my determination to document my experiences with childhood friends. Eager to learn, I approached Mr. Weber himself, posing the question: "How do I write a book? Balancing full-time school, work, basketball, and personal commitments, how can I embark on this journey?"

His advice was simple yet profound — to slow down, relax, and just write. He suggested dedicating one hour a day to the craft. This piece of wisdom has stuck with me for 23 years. Unafraid to seek guidance, I started connecting with other inspiring authors like Zane, Michael

Pressly, Crystal Lacy Wilson, Waidha Clarke, KiKi-Swanton, and most importantly, HopeClarke. Hope taught me the business side of being an independent author.

My first book, "True Brothers and Their Pride and Joy," took two years to write, but my determination remained unwavering. Along the way, I had the privilege of

meeting and gaining advice from various celebrities, including Bill Cosby, whom I still consider America's dad. LL Cool J emphasized the importance of not losing focus on my dreams, and Spike Lee encouraged me to pick up a camera and shoot when I'm ready, noting the accessibility of filmmaking through smartphones.

In 2001, BlackPowerPublishing was born, though my first book didn't hit the shelves until 2003. The name stemmed from my identity as a Black man with the last name Power, coinciding with my venture into the publishing business. In my early twenties, I discovered the significance of Power and the Black Power movement, realizing that there were aspects of history I had to self-teach because society might not readily provide such knowledge.

In life, certain things require self-education, and I give thanks to Jehovah — God over everything. Regardless of religious beliefs, I acknowledge that there is only one God. Reflecting on history, I believe that the faith of our ancestors was taken from them over 400 years ago when they were brought to America. Instead of unity, a desire to keep us apart prevailed. I share this insight to encourage you. If reading this doesn't inspire you to pursue your dreams and never give up, take a moment to pause. Seek God first, pray for your dreams and goals, and remember that without God, life can be a colossal drama.

By 2007, I had found comfort in my identity and embraced the author I had become. Attending book signings and consistently selling books at the Harlem Book Fair, I was ready to venture into scriptwriting for my first and second novels. Equipping myself with knowledge through screenwriting and directing courses, I found inspiration and support at Moving Mountains, thanks to my friend and little brother Domoo, alongside mentors Jamie Hector and Ms. Robinson. This organization dedicated itself to empowering the community through arts education.

Having attended various stage plays by Tyler Perry, David E Tablet, and Jecrarus Johnson, and with the influence of Moving Mountains, I aspired to create my own stage play. Thus,

BlackPowerProduction was born, featuring my first play, "Someone's Gotta Be on Top." Unexpectedly, I not only acted in it but also took on the roles of director, producer, and writer. The experience wasn't initially planned this way, as my lead actor had to step away, but my mantra was and remains, "No excuses."

Wyatt, a one-person riot and actor/comedian, played a pivotal role, hosting all my stage plays and offering mentorship. He emphasized a crucial lesson: "No one gives a [care]. Unless you believe in your dreams, no one else will." Over time, he clarified the meaning: don't expect universal support, and the results you desire often lie beyond your excuses. His words served as a reminder that, as an author, I should never be broke. "You are one person away from the person you want to meet. Your books are like a drug, and a drug dealer is never broke."

Rather than getting upset, I used Wyatt's statement as motivation and a source of great inspiration. This underscores the importance of the people you surround yourself with in determining your life's direction. By my second stage play, I had four books out, including

"Someone's Gotta Be on Top," my third novel based on the stage play, and "Year of the Gentlemen," my fourth novel. The latter was inspired by attending my childhood friend Antwan's wedding, prompting me to reflect on the power of inspiration.

I express my hopes for the success of all my brothers and sisters. In my opinion, only fools are envious of their friends.

There are moments in life when you may need to distance yourself from family and friends, and it's not personal; it's about recognizing that people have different levels of ambition. Not everyone can accompany you on your journey because not everyone shares the same drive. It's essential to stop trying to bring everyone along because

not everyone aspires to reach the next level. Many are content where they are, and that's perfectly fine. However, for those with dreams and goals, those who aim to ascend to the next level, I encourage you to pursue and accomplish them.

Don't share your aspirations with everyone; instead, focus on your goals quietly. Steer clear of negativity and toxic influences. Remember, you attract whatever you focus on, so concentrate on your dreams and those who inspire you to do so. Even when your goals are unknown to others, remaining consistent can be challenging, but that's where discipline and faith come in. Celebrate every small step toward your dream, be your own cheerleader, and remember the valuable advice I received from Wyatt: "No one gives a care." In reality, no one is coming to rescue you or fix your life or help you achieve your goals. If someone does lend a helping hand, consider it a blessing and express gratitude.
